# **MINUTES FOR NOVEMBER 29, 2010**

## COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHEROKEE COUNTY

#### OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK

#### CRYSTAL L. GATEWOOD

The Cherokee Commissioners met November 29, 2010. Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins and Garner were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all present. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve the minutes for November 22, 2010 as presented by County Clerk Crystal Gatewood, his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner, and all three commissioners voted in favor and signed, off as well as County Clerk Gatewood.

## MOTIONS MADE BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Collins made a motion for a fifteen minute break at 11:00 AM, his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner, and all three commissioners voted in favor. They resumed the regular meeting at 11:15 AM.

Commissioner Garner made a motion to break for lunch at 11:30 AM, his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins, and all three commissioners voted in favor. They resumed the regular meeting at 1:00 PM.

#### OTHER BUSINESS

County Treasurer Juanita Hodgson brought in the monthly reports for fund balances. These are attached to the November 29, 2010 minutes.

County Auditor Gene Mense came before the commission to discuss the 2010 Cherokee County Budget and said overall the budget was on schedule, but it would depend upon the sales tax revenues in December for the county. Mr. Mense said if the county continued conservative spending, the county will have \$46,000.00 left over from the 2010 budget. Mr. Mense also said the Road & Bridge Budget for 2010 was a concern because the commission had purchased dump trucks using the Road & Bridge Budget to pay for the trucks, and he suggested that the commission replace that money from the Special Machinery Line Item that the commission had set up earlier in 2010. The Commissioners each thanked all the Elected Officials and Department Heads for staying under budget and working together for the citizens of Cherokee County.

Ray Ryan of Ryan Insurance Company submitted his proposal for the Commissioners' review for the Work Comp and Property Insurance for Cherokee County for 2011. He explained the differences involving fully insured coverage of these proposals and being in a pool as Cherokee County is at this time. The Ryan proposal is on file in the Cherokee County Clerk's Office. The commissioners asked questions and thanked him for his proposal. Mr. Ryan also will be back on December 13, 2010 to talk with the commissioners again and present more information. The commissioners thanked him for coming in.



Sean Turner with Tran-systems met with the Commissioners about Cherokee County Sewer Districts # 1 and #2, he said that he is waiting for approval from KDHE so the county can start the bidding process for the sewer project. Commissioner Garner welcomes all those interested in bidding on the project to come forward when the time comes. The commission thanked him for giving them an update. He also spoke about a possible sewer and water system installation near I-44. Mr. Turner suggested to the commission any future systems installed that they needed to be in natural drainage basins. The commission thanked him for the update.

Carl Eyman of KWORC and Tom Job of KCAMP came before the commissioners and submitted a proposal for work comp and property insurance for 2011. They updated the commission on their proposal and explained and answered questions from the commission regarding their proposal. The commissioners thanked them for coming in and for their hard work. Cherokee County has been insured with KWORC and KCAMP for several years and, are charter members of the pool.

## **ADJOURNMENT**

Commissioner Collins made a motion to adjourn at 2:23 PM, his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner, and all three commissioners voted in favor. The next Cherokee County Commission meeting will be held December 6, 2010 at 9:00 AM in the Cherokee County Courthouse in Columbus, Kansas.
