

**MINUTES FOR JANUARY 23, 2017**  
**BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**  
**CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS**

**CONVENE**

Chairman Collins called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 AM on Monday, January 23, 2017 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Pat Collins, Neal Anderson, Cory Moates, County Counselor Barbara Wright, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

Members of the press present: Larry Hiatt, Machel Smith, and Jordan Zabel

Noxious Weed Director Logan Grant presented the 2016 Annual Noxious Weed Eradication Report for review by the Board. He also presented the 2017 Noxious Weed Management Plan for approval. The Board signed both documents.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to enter a 20 minute Executive Session with the Board for the purpose of Non-Elected Personnel for a period of 20 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:05 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 9:25 AM.

No action was taken during the Executive Session.

**Leonard Vanatta - County Road Supervisor**  
**Louis Schreiner - County Lot Supervisor**

They appeared before the Board on routine county road business. They reviewed the protocol for road closings due to high water with the Board. Leonard presented invoices for the County Highway Association and Kansas Association of Counties for the Board to review. The Board approved the expenditures. Leonard stated that bids for the Galena Bridge Project will be opened on February 13<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 AM. He stated that there is a meeting on Thursday regarding the detour for the remainder of the Highway 7 Project when it starts up again in May.

**Janet Miller, Trish Carroll - Cherokee County Economic Development Corporation**

They appeared at the request of the Board to discuss the 2017 funding. County Ag Agent Dale Helwig appeared also to provide information regarding a program that is available through Kansas State University for Economic Development. He stated that Rawlins County has used the program for years and they are willing to do a demonstration on how it has worked for them. Dale stated that the County Extension Council would like to assist with Economic Development. He will arrange the demo and let the Board know when it will take place.

Janet provided a Treasurer's Report for the Economic Development Corporation as of January 20, 2017. The current balance is \$39,493.10. She provided an update on the upcoming programs for this year. She provided a list of current memberships and stated that there are 30 members that have joined. She stated that they are averaging two or three new members monthly. Trish stated that they would like clarification on Resolution 02-2017 that was passed by the Board regarding the funding process for Economic Development. They would like to know how the process of paying monthly expenses is going to work. Janet stated that her idea would be for the county contribution to go toward the salary for the director and membership dollars would be contributed toward the salary and other expenses. Commissioner Collins stated that he would like to see it put on a ballot regarding how much to spend, but that we need to get by this year. Counselor Wright stated that she would like to have a brief discussion for Attorney Client on this issue.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to enter an Executive Session to include the Board, Counselor Wright, and Clerk Edmondson for 10 minutes for the purpose of Attorney/Client Privilege. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:54 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 10:04 AM.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to enter an Executive Session with the Board, Counselor Wright, Janet Miller, Trish Carroll, Brian Smith, and Clerk Edmondson for 10 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 10:07 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 10:22 AM.

Commissioner Moates stated that the session was for the purpose of Non-Elected Personnel for contracts.

Janet presented a list of Economic Development Advisory Committee members for appointment. She stated that Position 8 and 9 will need new members. Position 9 is for the County Commissioner so the Board will need to decide who will serve. She stated that all other members have agreed to continue to serve.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to table the Economic Development decision until February 6, 2017 at 10:30 AM.

#### **Mike Cosgrove - Mercy Lifeline**

He appeared to introduce himself to the new Commissioners. He stated that he is working with Deana to get interested employees signed up as members for the program.

#### **Wayne Elliott - 911 Mapping and Addressing**

He appeared before the Board to propose a new price list for the sale of maps. He stated that it has been seven years since the prices had changed and is proposing a slight increase in prices. He also stated that it has been the policy to provide free aerial maps to property owners of

their own property. The Board agreed to continue providing those maps free to property owners.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to accept the new pricing for maps and to follow the guidelines provided. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. Larry Hiatt stated that everything in that office is paid for by tax dollars already being collected and asked why raise the prices when that fund doesn't need it. The motion carried 3-0.

The Board discussed the KAMO PILOT payment made to the County. There have been two payments of \$50,000 made to the school district from funds received from KAMO paid to Cherokee County.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to pay USD 493 \$50,000 as agreed. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0. Chairman Collins reminded everyone that the County is now receiving considerably less than the amount that was agreed to by KAMO.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to recess for 10 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:34 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 9:44 AM.

Attorney Robert Myers appeared before the Board regarding future tax foreclosure sales. He provided statistics on the number of properties and the back taxes that are owed to the County. He reported that the current tax sale hasn't been filed in court yet. He stated that there is a list from October, 2015 with 504 properties on it that isn't being worked yet. He stated that six months ago a letter was sent to all area attorney's seeking interest in doing tax sale, with no response from anyone. He would like to present a three year plan to do tax sales for the County. He stated that he would have the first one ready by August 1, 2017 and subsequent years would be ready by June 15<sup>th</sup> each year. He stated that his plan would allow for title search fees to be invoiced to the county when they are completed but that he would not invoice the County for his fees until the sale is done. The Board asked him to get with Counselor Wright and work on a written agreement.

#### **Matt Lafata - Riverton Little League Baseball**

He appeared before the Board representing the Riverton Little League. They are in need of truckloads of road millings to cover the parking lot between the practice fields. They don't want to use lime rock any more. He also asked about getting assistance in sealing the main parking lot that was paved by the County a few years ago. The Board took the request under advisement and will look into the availability of the millings.

#### **Shawn Turner - Transystems**

#### **Susan Goshert, Debra Gould - First American Title Co.**

They appeared at the request of the Board to work out the issue of title insurance on the sewer project in the Riverton area. Shawn stated that title insurance is needed to process the loan,

but there is no clean easement for the property that Empire owns. Susan stated that their underwriter is wanting the county to acquire fee simple ownership of the property before title insurance can be issued. It was determined that First American will provide a document to Shawn that can be presented to Empire in an attempt to acquire ownership of the property instead of an easement. Shawn will work with Counselor Wright on a written proposal to submit to Empire. The Board asked for a progress report in 30 days.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to deny the Applications for Cereal Malt Beverage Licenses for the Lightning Creek Bait and Tackle Shop. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

Clerk Edmondson presented the County Commissioner Redistricting Map for second read by the Board. The map would remove the Spring Valley/Spring Valley voting district from Commission District 2, and place it in Commission District 3.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to accept the Redistricting of the Commissioner Districts Map as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0.

Clerk Edmondson presented Resolution 04-2017 for second read by the Board.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve Resolution 04-2017, adjusting Cherokee County Commission District lines as presented. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

The Board discussed the appointments of the Contract Attorney's to the District Court. The Board decided to have interested persons to appear before the Board for interviews. The Board set February 6, 2017 at 1:30 PM to begin those interviews. Counselor Wright will notify all interested attorneys.

The Board discussed the Stockton Restoration Agreement for maintenance on the Courthouse. The unapproved agreement was given to the new Commissioners by Counselor Wright. The Board set it for review next week.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to enter an Executive Session with the Board and Leonard Vanatta for 20 minutes for the purpose of Non-Elected Personnel for disciplinary actions. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 11:24 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 11:44 AM.

Citizen Mike Langerot appeared before the Board concerning county owned property that he thought was owned by his family. The property has been used by his family for over 50 years, as it was thought to be their property. He would like to acquire that property from the County. The Board determined that sealed bids would need to be taken for the property. The Board referred it to Counselor Wright to review and prepare a public notice of the taking of sealed bids.

The Board tabled until next week the League of Kansas Municipalities membership invoice until Clerk Edmondson checks with the cities in the county on their cost of membership.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to approve the Minutes of the January 11, 2017 BOCC meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve the Minutes of the January 9, 2017 BOCC meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Anderson made a motion to adjourn until the next regular meeting set for Monday, January 30, 2017 at 9:00 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0 at 11:58 AM.



RESOLUTION NO. 04-2017

**A RESOLUTION ADJUSTING CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSION DISTRICT  
LINES FOR CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF  
CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS, THAT THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION BE  
ADOPTED:**

**SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORITY.** K.S.A. 19-101, *et. seq.*, and K.S.A. 19-212 authorize the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, Kansas, to transact all County business and perform all powers of local legislation deemed appropriate, and to make all contracts and do all other acts in relation to the property and concerns of the County necessary to the exercise of its corporate or administrative powers.

**SECTION 2. LEGISLATIVE ACTION.** Pursuant to K.S.A. 19-204, "The board of county commissioners, on the day of the organization of the board or as soon thereafter as may be possible, shall meet and divide the county into three commissioner districts or such number of districts as is prescribed by resolution of the board, as compact and equal in population as possible, and number them. Such districts shall be subject to alteration at least once every three years."


**SECTION 3. COUNTY COMMISSION DISTRICT ADJUSTMENTS.** While maintaining internal precinct lines, and adjusting the Cherokee County district lines, according to the latest census, and in compliance with the requirement that the County Commission districts be compact and equal, the Board of County Commissioners of Cherokee County, Kansas, adopts the district lines of the three County Commission districts, as adjusted, numbered and reflected on the map, Attachment "A", dated January 23, 2017, hereinafter incorporated by reference as the official Cherokee County Commission District Map.

**SECTION 4. PUBLICATION.** The County Clerk shall cause this resolution to be published in the official County Newspaper.





To fulfill the requirements of the Kansas Noxious Weed Law and Regulations, the Kansas Department of Agriculture is providing the Annual Noxious Weed Eradication Form. Please completely fill out all sections and return all of them, including the worksheets, by **February 15, 2017** to our address at:

In addition, enclosed is your annual approval for 2017 based on 2016 performance. The requirements to receive approval are: submission of the Annual Noxious Weed Eradication Report, Annual Management Plan, and maintaining 9a pesticide applicators certification. If you did not receive your annual approval, it is because one or more of these requirements was not met. Please contact me for more information. Also enclosed are the random survey sections for 2017. It is recommended that you visit these sections several times during the year to get an accurate representation of noxious weed infestations. Finally, K.S.A. 2-1331(b) requires the Kansas Department of Agriculture to notify in writing each county noxious weed supervisor of a general notice of noxious weed infestation and the annual report form. The general notice may be published in the local newspaper during the month of March and will constitute the first notice to landowners with noxious weed infestations.

## Cherokee County Annual Noxious Weed Management Plan

### ***NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL ON COUNTY LAND***

**Johnson Grass** - Johnson Grass on County Right-of-Way and other County Lands will be treated as follows: The County Roadside will be patrolled on a continuous day-to-day basis and all Johnson Grass found will be treated with a glyphosate product and or Oust.

**Field Bindweed** - The County Roadside will be patrolled on a daily basis, and the Bindweed infestation will be recorded and treated as soon as possible.

**Musk Thistle** - All County Roadsides will be patrolled early in the growing season to locate any infestation of Musk Thistle, any Musk Thistle found will be recorded and treated as soon as possible

**Sericea Lespedeza** - All County Roadsides and County owned land will be patrolled and mapped to locate any infestation and treatment will be handled in a timely manner.

**Multiflora Rose** – Multiflora Rose on County Right-of-Way and other County Lands will be treated as follows: The County Roadside will be patrolled on a continuous day-to-day basis, all Multiflora Rose found will be treated with a glyphosate product and or Oust.

**Note:**

While patrolling the roadside for the above five noxious weeds an eye will be kept open for any other noxious weeds and invasive species. If any are found, they will be taken care of if budget is there to do so.

### ***NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL ON PRIVATE LAND***

#### **A. Johnson Grass**

1. Johnson Grass on private land will be surveyed during the daily patrol of the county roadside
2. All infestations of Johnson Grass on private land will be monitored to see if there is any effort being made toward control.
3. Johnson Grass in Cherokee County has two classifications:
  - a. In or near crop land: This is our primary concern....the land owner is personally contacted as soon as it is evident that the problem is being neglected. This approach has worked well.
  - b. Non-Crop land: This is classified as pasture or marginal land. Johnson Grass in these areas are treated with less concern than those in crop lands. The land owner is contacted and direction is given for control.  
Chemical control for Johnson Grass will be as recommended

by State Board of Agriculture, chemicals will be cost shared to the land owner 75%.

**B. Bindweed**

1. Field Bindweed is treated in the same manner as all other noxious weeds. Infestations are checked during the regular patrolling of the county road system.

**C. Musk Thistle**

1. Musk Thistle has been controlled by the use of Milestone, 24D and Escort. Milestone, and 24D are used when the plant is in bolt, Spring treatment requires ½ ounce of Escort and Fall treatment requires 24D.

**D. Canada Thistle**

1. Canada Thistle is treated in the same manner as all other noxious weeds. Infestations are checked during the regular patrolling of the county road system.

***NON-NOXIOUS WEEDS***

**A. Non-Noxious weeds and brush are treated differently each year, which is dependent upon the budget.**

1. During most of the past years, spraying around most bridge guard rails when the chemical is available for such weed control. Foliage that makes roadways hazardous to drivers are also sprayed when the chemical is available.

***CITY LANDS***

**A. Noxious weeds in the cities are maintained by the city or by private land owners.**

## ***SURVEY***

- A. The survey will be conducted as recommended by the State Board of Agriculture. Maps provided by that Cherokee County mapping department that show sections and acreage have made the surveying much easier.

## ***OUTREACH***

- A. The annual "General Notice To Control Noxious Weeds" is sent out annually.
- B. Member of Southeast Kansas Weed Directors Association.

## ***FACILITIES***


