MINUTES FOR MAY 14, 2012

COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHEROKEE COUNTY

OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK

The Cherokee County Commissioners met May 14, 2012. Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all present. Commissioner Garner made a motion to approve the minutes for May 7, 2012 as presented by Cherokee County Clerk Crystal Gatewood; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner voting in favor. Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins and Garner, and County Clerk Gatewood signed off on the minutes. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve and pay May mid-month Accounts Payables; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor. Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand and Collins, and Clerk Gatewood signed off on the documentation. Clerk Gatewood submitted her monthly budget report on County Funds to the commission. They are attached to these minutes.

EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

County Appraiser Nancy Herrenbruck requested executive session for Personnel/Non-Elected. Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to go into Executive Session for Personnel/Non Elected for ten minutes with himself, Commissioners Collins and Garner, the County Counselor, Deana Randall, and Nancy Herrenbruck; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor. They went in at 11:20 AM and returned at 11:34 AM.

Attorney David Cooper requested Executive Session for Attorney/Client Privilege for Pending Litigation. Commissioner Collins made the motion to go into Executive Session viatelephone for Attorney/Client Privilege regarding Penn Gaming for twenty minutes with himself, Commissioners Collins and Garner, the County Counselor, and Attorneys David Cooper and Teresa Watson; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went out at 11:35 AM and returned at 11:55 AM.

MOTIONS MADE BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Garner made the motion to purchase and replace the air conditioner at the County Extension Office from Commercial and Residential Services, Inc. at the bid price of \$2,862.00, and this will be paid for by the County General Fund Line Item Employee Compensation Fund; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor.



Commissioner Garner made a motion to move Larry Sharp from 11:00 AM to 10:45 AM on the Agenda; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor.

Commissioner Collins made the motion to table the Pit Bull Resolution to next week, and further discussion is needed regarding the Employee Handbook; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor.

FINAL CANVASS RESULTS FOR USD 508 SPECIAL ELECTION HELD MAY 8, 2012

The Cherokee County Commission and County Election Officer reviewed 40 provisional ballots; 21 were validated by the board and 19 were not valid. After the final review the results were totaled with 586 residents voting YES and 342 voting NO on a General Bond Obligation Issue for USD 508. A motion was made by Commissioner Hilderbrand to certify the Election Results for the Special Election for USD 508 held May 8, 2012; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand and Collins voting in favor. Those signing the final documentation for the USD 508 Special Election were Commissioners Garner, Collins and Hilderbrand, Cherokee County Election Officer Crystal Gatewood, Deputy Clerk Paula Cheney, and the County Counselor. A copy of the final results and the official certification is attached to these minutes.

OTHER BUSINESS

Leonard Vanatta of Road and Bridge came before the commission and gave his weekly road and bridge report. Sportsman Pit road will be having work done on it for the next three or four months and he reported the road will not be closed to the public.

Dennis Elbrader brought bids for replacing the air conditioning unit at the County Extension Office and asked the commission for help in the replacement costs of the unit. The commission agreed to pay the entire sum of \$2,862.00 out of The County General Fund.

Jason Allison of Emergency Preparedness reported that testing of the area sirens was being done. The commission asked Allison to check on the sound level of the sirens in the Riverton area.

Betha Elliott of the Cherokee County Health Department submitted a request for raises, all were less than 3%, for the Health Department employees. Mrs. Elliott reported the funds are available and they were expecting more grant funds in July. The commission agreed to look the request over and get back with her on their decision.

County Counselor Cure is going to resend the Employee Handbook and let everyone have time to go over it, and plans a discussion at a later date.

Larry Sharp of KCAMP came before the commission to give the commission the annual update on County Liability and Casualty Insurance. The county reported eleven claims last year, four of which were deer hits; the state average was for every ten casualty and property claims there was one liability, and liability is a higher dollar amount in claims. He talked about a \$2,000 Risk

Management Grant available. The two biggest factors for Liability and Casualty Insurance are the loss ratio and addition/deletion of property. He reported that Law Enforcement and Public Works are generally the biggest annual claims filers for liability in the state of Kansas with Commissioners in fourth due to slips and falls in the county buildings. The commission thanked him for coming in.

ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 12:12 PM: his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Garner, and Collins voting in favor. The next Cherokee County Commission meeting will be held May 21, 2012 at 9:00 AM in the Cherokee County Courthouse in Columbus, Kansas.
