### MINUTES FOR JUNE 9, 2014

#### **BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS**

#### CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS

#### **CONVENE**

Commissioner Hilderbrand called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 AM on Monday, June 9, 2014 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Richard Hilderbrand, Charles Napier, Pat Collins, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

### **Sheriff David Groves - County Health Insurance Committee**

He appeared before the Board representing the Health Insurance Committee. It's the recommendation of Brian Hilliar and the committee to add Mercy Clinic and four other physicians to the list of providers to be covered at network pricing.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the recommendations of the Insurance Committee and add the providers as outlined in the agreement. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Minutes of the June 2, 2014 BOCC Meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Hilderbrand to amend the agenda from 9:30 a.m. to 9:15 a.m. for the Cherokee County Extension Council. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes.

#### Clark Hall - Cherokee County Extension Council

He appeared with members of the Extension Council to present their 2015 Budget Request to the Board.

The request reflects an increase of approximately 1.78%, or nearly \$4,300. Auditing costs, equipment, and educational programs are some of the lines that were increased.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the presented budget for fiscal year 2015 for the Cherokee County Extension Council. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Mid-Month Accounts Payables for June, 2014. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes.

At 9:30 AM the Board recessed until 10:00 AM.

At 10:00 AM the Board convened in the District Courtroom for the meeting with KDWPT, KDHE and the Mine Reclamation project in Cherokee County.

### Special Meeting with KDHE Mine Reclamation, and KDWPT

The Board, KDHE, and KDWPT conducted a public meeting in the District Courtroom to hear concerns from citizens over mined land reclamation taking place in Cherokee County.

Murray Balk presented a program on Surface Mining Control and Reclamation in Cherokee County. Kansas began abandoned mine work in 1983. They have been doing work in Cherokee County for 30 years and spent \$13 million. The program is set to sunset in 2026, then Cherokee County would be responsible for any and all work needed in the area.

The Deer Creek II Reclamation Project has seen \$120,000 in road improvements. The total cost is \$3.5 million. It's been #1 on the inventory since the program began. Work is expected to finish this fall.

David Jenkins, manager of the Mined Land Wildlife Area, presented a program on the improvements made for fish and wildlife. The MLWA receives 300,000 visitors each year.

Both representatives stated that all other projects are small compared to the Deer Creek Project.

The meeting concluded at 11:35 AM.

At 11:45 AM the meeting reconvened in the Commission Room.

### Jean Pritchett - Tourism Grant

She appeared before the Board with a Tourism Grant Request from "We Run Kansas" for a half marathon. The date is set for October 12, 2014. They are requesting \$300 in grant funds.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the grant request from "We Run Kansas Half Marathon" for \$300 in tourism funds. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes.

### **Kevin Cure - County Counselor**

He appeared before the Board regarding legal matters concerning Cherokee County.

He reviewed the Agreement for Purchase of Services with Labette Community College and Commissioner Hilderbrand signed the agreement.

He estimates the next tax foreclosure sale to be held in early September.

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to adjourn until the next regularly scheduled meeting set for June 16, 2014 at 9:00 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0 with all in attendance voting yes at 12:15 PM.


This year, the We Run Kansas long distance running team is planning a half marathon race which will take the contestants on a 13.1 mile trip through both the city limits and rural areas of Columbus. The race will begin at the clock tower in front of the Cherokee County Courthouse, and end at the city park on S Kansas Avenue. Participants in this half marathon will literally take a tour of Columbus, running by nearly every Columbus business, a section of Highway 160, the rural countryside of both East and West Maple as well as East and West Country Road, the Cherokee County Law Enforcement Center, Titan Alley, and the city square.

The plan is for this race to be held in October during Columbus Days, attracting more visitors to the area for the Columbus Days events. The timing of this race is of most importance in 2014, as the Mother Road Marathon announced on December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2013 that their race has been cancelled indefinitely. The cancellation of the Mother Road Marathon has opened the door for greater participation potential in the We Run Kansas Half Marathon in Columbus, as runners will be searching for events in lieu of the Mother Road.

As this is a first year event, it is difficult to predict the actual number of runners who will compete in this race, but with proper planning, the event could literally see a thousand or more participants. I have begun the process of contacting companies for the race timing, medals, age placement awards, and t-shirts. We would also like to include "swag bags" to give to each runner with their race packet. Included in this bag would be small items from sponsoring businesses. These items could be key chains, magnets, business cards, pens, etc. This event will be conducted with the utmost professionalism in order to attract runners from both near and far, and to create an event that can be scheduled annually.

### AGREEMENT FOR PURCHASE OF SERVICES

This AGREEMENT, made and entered into the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of June 2014, by and between LABETTE COMMUNITY COLLEGE, hereinafter called "College," and, Cherokee County, hereinafter called "Provider."

WHEREAS, the Kansas Community College Task Force has charged the Kansas Community College system with the following mission, among others:

- \* To provide customized educational training programs to assist qualified employers to train their employees in job related skills;
- \* To provide courses, associate degree programs, certificates, and other vocational/technical training to prepare students to update their job skills, to advance in their jobs, to retrain in new job fields or recreation/personal growth opportunities to allow employees to remain productive in a competitive environment.

WHEREAS, The Kansas Board of Regents has set policy on the provision of education and training to providers.

WHEREAS, the College desires to utilize the services of the Provider in providing both specialized and general education to students of the college.

WHEREAS, the Provider desires to provide the services to the College and to provide the College the benefit of its unique skills, knowledge, facilities, and equipment toward carrying out the educational mission of the College and thereby improving the educational opportunities of its employees.

NOW, THEREFORE, the College and the Provider agree as follows:

- I. <u>Services to be provided</u>. Services provided to the College by the Provider shall include but not be limited to the following:
  - a. <u>Classroom facilities</u>. Cherokee County will serve as a training site for educational programs or classes conducted by the College. The Provider will maintain complete authority and control over classroom facilities at Cherokee County facility. The furnishing of the aforesaid facilities shall be subject to the scheduling and control of the Provider in keeping with the rules and regulations of the College. Employees shall be subject to the scheduling and control of the Provider in keeping with the rules and regulations of the College.
  - b. <u>Equipment usage</u>. The Provider will make available to the College access to and use of equipment necessary to conduct specialized training in the operation, use or maintenance of such equipment.
  - c. <u>Faculty</u>. The Provider will offer, when appropriate, qualified faculty members who will be under a College instructional contract for the programs. The faculty will be responsible to the college for the instruction, control and supervision of the students consistent with the rules and regulations of the College.
  - d. <u>Consulting</u>. The Provider will provide consulting services to the college based upon unique skills of its officers, employees or agents. Such consultation may relate to course curriculum, personal educational needs of employees or other areas as deemed appropriate by the College.

- e. <u>Supplies</u>. The Provider will make available to the College supplies or course material deemed appropriate by the College and the Provider.
- f. <u>General</u>. The Provider will offer such other services as may be agreed upon from time to time.
- II. Scholarships. The College agrees to provide scholarships, including normal fees, to employees of the Provider based on a request for the training and verification of employment by the employer; verification must be received <u>during</u> each semester in which the employee is attending the College. The employee will pay material, lab and other equipment usage fees incurred through enrollment in training.
- III. <u>Students</u>. It is understood that the Provider may from time to time enroll individuals designated by the Provider in classes offered by the College.
- IV. Offering of Courses. The determination of courses to be offered and the determination of the number of students required to offer a course shall remain at the sole discretion of the College in consultation with the Provider. The Provider reserves the right to restrict the types of courses covered by this agreement. If the Provider restricts the courses, an attachment will be added to this document.
- V. <u>Termination or Modification of Agreement</u>. This agreement is for a period of one (1) year and is renewable. The agreement may be terminated by either party at the conclusion of any semester by providing the other party with written notice sixty (60) days prior to the beginning of the next semester.
