MINUTES FOR JUNE 30, 2017

BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS

CONVENE

Chairman Collins called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, June 30, 2017 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Pat Collins, Neal Anderson, Cory Moates, County Counselor Barbara Wright, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

Members of the press present: Larry Hiatt

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins for an executive session with County Attorney Jacob Conard and Counselor Wright for the purpose of the discipline of non-elected personnel for a period of 15 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:06 a.m.

The meeting reconvened at 9:21 a.m.

No action was taken during the executive session.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates for an executive session for the purpose of Attorney Client privilege for potential litigation with Counselor Wright and County Treasurer Juanita Hodgson. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:22 a.m.

The meeting reconvened at 9:37 a.m.

No action was taken during the executive session.

The Board instructed Treasurer Hodgson to take the proper action to correct a title issue.

Treasurer Hodgson provided updated budget and fund balance reports for the Board to review. She stated that she is concerned about a \$513 reimbursement to Treasurer-elect Raven for training expenses. She objected to the expenses being paid out of the Treasurer's budget that she still has control over. The Board asked Counselor Wright to get with Gene Mense and review it and determine where the funds should be paid from. The Board approved the expenditure from treasurer funds and will make a transfer if Counselor Wright determines they should be paid from other funds.

Leonard Vanatta, County Road Supervisor, appeared before the Board on routine county road business. He presented a project programming request from KDOT to improve the intersection of SE 20th St. and SE Brush Creek Rd. in Neutral to accommodate new railroad gates and flashers. The Board signed the request.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins for an executive session for the purpose of discipline of non-elected personnel with the Board, Counselor Wright, and Leonard Vanatta for a period of five minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 9:57 a.m.

The meeting reconvened at 10:02 a.m.

No action was taken during the executive session.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to approve the payroll for the period ending June 23, 2017. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Moates. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve the accounts payable for the period ending June 28, 2017. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve the minutes of the June 26, 2017 BOCC meeting as amended. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

Ralph Houser, Courthouse Maintenance Director, appeared before the Board regarding projects needed for 2018 from the courthouse budget. He stated that there were some leaks still showing up around the windows after the exterior work was done. He has contacted Stockton Restoration about getting them fixed and they will be covered by the warranty. He updated the Board on projects that have been completed this year. He would like to get more of the old air conditioning units replaced at the end of the year or next year.

Jim Tunnell and Sue Drennan appeared before the Board regarding the 2018 budget request for the solid waste recycling program. The request includes \$3200 for an e-waste collection with those costs being offset by any donations that are received. The trailers and bins will need maintenance next year and they hope to make some modifications to trailers so Galena, Baxter Springs, and Scammon would have to share a trailer on a rotation basis. They stated that 82% of the recycling is coming from the City of Columbus trailer. They stated that each person generates 4.5 pounds of waste every day, but that can be reduced by 1.5 pounds just by recycling. Commissioner Moates asked for their input on the tire recycling center that is being proposed near the Blue Hole mine pit in Galena. He would like some clarification on how that center is going to run. Sue stated that the solid waste advisory board is planning to meet next week and they will let the Board know when the meeting is going to take place. Carl Hayes, stated that they have extended an invitation to Doug Gatewood to be a member of the solid waste committee. Carl stated that he would bring that to the Board for approval at a later date.

Rodney Edmondson, Cherokee County Clerk & Election Officer, appeared before the Board to present the 2018 budget requests for the Clerk and Election departments. The request for the Clerk's budget is the same amount as this year. The request for the Election budget is the same amount as 2016. 2018 will be a gubernatorial election year and it will be a busy year. It will also see the new election laws in place that will combine some local city elections on the general election ballot with state and federal races in November. He is asking that the Board

commit to continuing the \$25,000 general fund line item for the purchase or lease of new election equipment that was put in the budget for 2017. New equipment has not been purchased yet, but he would like to begin the process later this year in order to have everything ready before the 2018 election cycle begins.

Counselor Wright stated that she had been in contact with Robert Myers and he stated that he would get an update to the Board regarding a tax sale. She also stated the Gene Barrett is on a working vacation next week and is hopeful to have his sale filed with the court by the end of next week.

Counselor Wright stated that the U.S. Court of Appeals has ruled on the Indian gaming lawsuit in federal court with the Quapaw Tribe. She stated that the case is back to square one, as the court dismissed the case by declaring that the Quapaw Tribe only had an advisory opinion from the NIGC and that opinion is not reviewable by the court.

Commissioner Moates made a motion to adjourn until the next regular meeting set for Monday, July 10, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0 at 11:32 a.m.

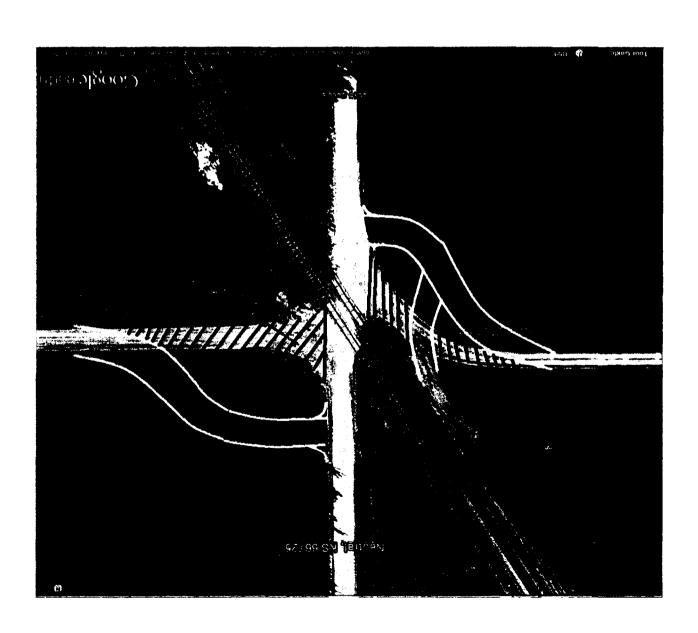
