MINUTES FOR OCTOBER 24, 2011

The Cherokee County Commissioners met October 24, 2011. The meeting was called to order by Commissioner Collins, and Commissioner Hilderbrand was present. Commissioner Garner was out of town. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all. County Clerk Crystal Gatewood submitted the minutes for October 17, 2011, Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to accept the minutes; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioners Collins and Hilderbrand, and Clerk Gatewood signed off on the documentation. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve and pay October 2011 Pay Roll; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Hilderbrand and Collins voting in favor. Commissioner Collins signed off on the documentation. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve and pay October 2011 Accounts/Payables; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Collins voting in favor. Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Collins voting in favor. Commissioners Collins and Hilderbrand, and County Clerk Gatewood signed off on the documentation.

Treasurer Juanita Hodgson brought in her report for October 2011 and a copy is attached to the minutes. Hodgson also reported that the reimbursement to the County General fund was received from the weather radios for the county and also Emergency Preparedness received \$20,236.00 for salary reimbursements, already paid out by the county from the state of Kansas. It is duly noted that with the funds reimbursed for Emergency Preparedness the account is no longer in the red. Commissioners Collins and Hilderbrand signed off on Voucher #9847 - to Pro CT for a computer purchase in the amount of \$3,511.00 for the County Appraiser's Office.

MOTIONS

Commissioner Hilderbrand requested an executive session for Personnel/Non-Elected. Commissioner Hilderbrand made the motion to go into **Executive Session for five minutes for Personnel/Non-Elected** with himself, Commissioner Collins and Leonard Vanatta of Road & Bridge; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Hilderbrand and Collins voting in favor. They went in at 9:30 AM and returned at 9:34 AM.

County Counselor Cure requested an executive session for Attorney/Client Privilege regarding potential litigation. Commissioner Hilderbrand made the motion to go into Executive Session for ten minutes for Attorney/Client Privilege regarding potential litigation with himself, Commissioner Collins, and County Counselor Kevin Cure; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Collins and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 11:50 AM and returned at 12:04 PM.



OTHER BUSINESS

Leonard Vanatta of Road and Bridge met with the commission and reported on general county maintenance. The commission requested a letter, to be written by Vanatta regarding general road conditions on Star Road, to be sent to the EPA. The commission requested two truck crossing signs on Highways 166 and 400. Tom Thomas came before the commission to ask about an area of land at SE 50th St. and Quaker Road in the flood plain, he wanted to grow a garden in the area. The commission told him to contact the owner of the land in the area and discuss what he wanted to do. The commission had him get the land description from the Register Of Deed's Office and the contact address from the Clerk Gatewood.

Citizen Raymond Griffith met with the commission to discuss the land issue; he was not satisfied with the meeting with the Fish and Game last week. The commission gave him contact information for Washburn University for the Law Department to discuss the matter with someone from the school.
