The Commission had a moment of silence for the city of Joplin. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve and pay May 2011 Account Payables and May Pay Roll: with Commissioner Hilderbrand seconding the motion and Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Those signing off on the documentation were Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, Collins, and Cherokee County Clerk Crystal Gatewood. Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to approve the minutes for May 16, 2011 as submitted by County Clerk Crystal Gatewood with Commissioner Collins seconding the motion and Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voted in favor; those signing off on the minutes were Commissioners Garner, Collins, Hilderbrand, and County Clerk Gatewood.

EXECUTIVE SESSIONS

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to go into Executive Session for Personnel/Non-Elected for ten minutes with himself and Commissioners Garner and Collins; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for Personnel/Non-Elected for five minutes with himself, Commissioners Garner and Hilderbrand, and Sheriff David Groves; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner; with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Jason also reported the weather is to continue the same over the next few days. They thanked him and asked him to keep them updated on the situation.

County Treasurer Juanita Hodgson submitted reports for county budget dollars they are attached.

The commission and Clerk Gatewood discussed the polling places in Cherokee County. She reported that she has been working on several precinct changes to make the drive shorter for the voters.

Brent Hillier representative of Meritain Health gave an update on the first quarterly report for 2011 insurance used by the county employees and their families. The County Health Panel will meet with him in the afternoon to ask questions and get a more detailed update on current and future coverage's for the county employees.
