MINUTES FOR MARCH 23, 2015

BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CONVENE

Commissioner Hilderbrand called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order and led all in attendance in the Pledge of Allegiance at 9:00 AM on Monday, March 23, 2015 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Commissioners Richard Hilderbrand, Charles Napier, Pat Collins, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

Members of the press present: Larry Hiatt, Machelle Smith, Jordan Zabel

The Board signed the Annual Noxious Weed Eradication Report for 2014, as presented by Director Kristin Seal.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Minutes of the BOCC Meeting for March 16, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Payroll for the month of March, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Collins to approve the Accounts Payables for the month of March, 2015. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0.

Leonard Vanatta - County Road Supervisor Gene Langerot - County Lot Supervisor

They appeared before the Board on routine county road business.

The Board discussed the bid process for asphalt, fuel, etc. and what items need to be bid. Bids are usually taken in May each year.

Carl Eyman - KWORCC

He appeared before the Board to provide an update on the county's Worker Compensation Insurance. He reported that 2014 was a bad year for the county and the pool as a whole.

A motion was made by Commissioner Napier to pay USD 493 \$50,000 from the KAMO PILOT monies that were received by Cherokee County. The payment will be made each of the next four years in April, pending receipt of the monies to Cherokee County from KAMO Power. Total to be paid is \$200,000. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0. This action amends the agreement from the BOCC meeting of July 1, 2013.

David Cooper - Legal Counsel

He appeared before the Board regarding legal matters concerning Cherokee County.

A motion made by Commissioner Hilderbrand to enter an Executive Session with the Board, Counsel David Cooper, and County Clerk Edmondson for the purpose of Attorney/Client Privilege for a period of 20 minutes. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0 at 10:30 AM.

The meeting reconvened at 10:50 AM.

No action was taken during the Executive Session.

At 10:50 AM the Board moved the open meeting from the Commission Room to the Break Room for more seating capacity to accommodate the number of people in attendance for the Solid Waste Management Resolution to be considered by the Board.

Chairman Hilderbrand invited comments from those in attendance prior to the Board considering the resolution.

Chairman Hilderbrand stated that since 1994 the county has had a process in place concerning solid waste. Any landfill considerations must go to the Solid Waste Committee first. He encouraged anyone that wants to do a landfill to work with the committee and to follow the proper process.

A motion was made by Chairman Hilderbrand to pass Resolution 08-2015, a revision of the Cherokee County Solid Waste Management Plan Five-Year Review Worksheet with the addendum. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Napier. The motion carried 3-0.

At 11:03 AM the open meeting moved back to the commission room.

Commissioner Napier made a motion to adjourn until the next regularly scheduled meeting set for March 30, 2015 at 9:00 AM. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins. The motion carried 3-0 with all voting yes at 11:45 AM.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS:

WHEREAS, the County in the form of its duly elected governing body has the authority under K.S.A. 19-101 to determine its local affairs and government, and;

WHEREAS, the County passed, on October 27, 2014, Resolution No. 19-2014 by which the governing body adopted the Solid Waste Management Committee's review and revision of the Solid Waste Management Plan, and;

WHEREAS, the County, as a participant in the Southeast Kansas Solid Waste Authority, may choose pursuant to K.S.A. 65-3405(h) to revise its Solid Waste Management Plan at a time which does not coincide with a scheduled annual review by the regional solid waste management committee, and;

WHEREAS, K.S.A. 65-3405(h) states the provisions of the interlocal agreement shall establish protocols for addressing the needs of the county seeking the change in the regional plan, and;

WHEREAS, the interlocal agreement does not provide any protocols for addressing the needs of the county seeking the change in the regional plan, and;

WHEREAS, the County is not seeking to change the regional plan but its own County Solid Waste Management Plan, and;

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Management Plan of the Southeast Kansas Solid Waste Authority recommends "the management of solid waste disposal should remain a function of the counties and municipalities, in cooperation with the private sector," and;

WHEREAS, the County may choose, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-3405(f), to revise its plan at a time which does not coincide with a scheduled annual review by the county solid waste management committee, and;

WHEREAS, the Solid Waste Management Committee met on February 18, 2015, and voted to recommend revisions to the County's Solid Waste Management Plan so as to revise Chapter 3. B) and Chapter 7 of the Solid Waste Management Plan to reflect:

1) the existing landfills meet the needs of the County,

2) there is no need for a new solid waste landfill in Cherokee County, and

3) no further solid waste landfills should be permitted or built in Cherokee County;

WHEREAS, a notice was published on February 25, 2015, in the Columbus News Report of a public meeting to be held on March 16, 2015, regarding the recommended solid waste management revisions;

WHEREAS, a quorum of the Solid Waste Management Committee was present and approved the recommended revisions;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF CHEROKEE COUNTY, the County's Solid Waste Management Plan Five-Year Review Worksheet with the addendum to Chapter 3. B) and Chapter 7 to reflect that the existing landfills meet the needs of the County, that there is no need for a new solid waste landfill in Cherokee County, and that no further solid waste landfills should be permitted or built in Cherokee County is adopted.





KWORCC Claim Analysis by Department


Claims From 1/1/2009 Through 11/30/2020
