MINUTES FOR JANUARY 31, 2011

COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHEROKEE COUNTY

OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK

The Cherokee County Commissioners met January 31, 2011. Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins and Garner were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all. Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to approve the revised minutes for January 24, 2011; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, Collins, and County Clerk Crystal Gatewood signed off on the minutes.

MOTIONS MADE BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Collins made a motion to allow Ralph Houser to do the maintenance needed on the Cherokee County Extension Office and the County Extension Office will pay Mr. Houser for the work done. His motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner, with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor.

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to pay \$1,000.00 to the City of Miami, Oklahoma regarding the Route 66 Travel Guide being published, which will include the Southeast Kansas Route 66 Businesses and area highlights along the route. The county will pay its share of \$500.00 along with the City of Galena's \$250.00, and the City of Baxter Springs share of \$250.00. The payment will come out of the County General Fund; the Recreation Line Item. His motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins, with Commissioners Collins, Hilderbrand, and Garner voting in favor. The commission thanked Phyllis Abbot and Cheryl Vogel for coming in and representing the areas cities and the Route 66 program for the county.

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to amend the agenda to move Scott Jackson from 11:15 AM to 11:05 AM, his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins, with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor.

Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to recess for lunch; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins, with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor.

OTHER BUSINESS

Cherokee County Sheriff David Groves and Jason Allison of Emergency Preparedness recommended to the commission that the courthouse be closed on Tuesday, February 1, 2011 due to the threat of severe weather coming to the area in the evening. Chairman Garner and Commissioner Collins agreed that due to the safety of the employees, the courthouse would be closed February 1, 2011. Commissioner Garner directed Jason Allison to get the information to the media so the public would know when the courthouse would be closed. Commissioner Garner would contact Cherokee County Clerk Crystal Gatewood and she would communicate with the other Department Heads and Elected Officials if the courthouse closed any additional days.

Treasurer Juanita Hodgson brought the January Sales Tax Revenues in and reported that revenues were up compared to this time last year (these are attached to the minutes). Treasurer Hodgson also gave an update on the Pitney-Bowes mailing system in the courthouse. The mailing system is up for renewal and the current machine that the courthouse uses is obsolete, the company will install and upgrade our system for \$763.00 a month. Commissioner Hilderbrand asked her to schedule a representative to come in and explain the system to them.

The Director of The Family Life Center, Scott Jackson came before the commission and gave an update on the completed Wellness Community Center located on 6610 SE Quakervale Rd. in the county (attached to the minutes is a copy of his presentation). The commission thanked him for the update and for coming in.

Road and Bridge Supervisor Leonard Vanatta came before the commission to discuss the general road and machinery maintenance being done in the county. The commission also discussed the possibility of severe weather in the county and Mr. Vanatta reported they were ready at the county lot. The commission approved the roads being deeded over to the county from George Lockwood and that County Counselor Kevin Cure would prepare the necessary paperwork and Leonard Vanatta would help in the process. A check came in from the state of Kansas Adjutant General's Department for the amount of \$390,887.91 for reimbursement from FEMA Disaster # 1885. The commission separated the amount of \$150,000.00 to the Special Bridge Fund, and the Road and Bridge Department will get \$240, 887.91.

ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Collins made a motion to adjourn at 12:40 PM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand and Collins voting in favor. The next Cherokee County Commission meeting will be held February 7, 2011 at 9:00 AM in the Cherokee County Courthouse in Columbus, Kansas.
