# **MINUTES FOR MARCH 21, 2011**

# COLUMBUS, KANSAS, CHEROKEE COUNTY

### OFFICE OF THE COUNTY CLERK

### CRYSTAL L. GATEWOOD

The Cherokee County Commissioners met March 21, 2011. Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand were present. The Pledge of Allegiance was said by all. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve the minutes as presented by County Clerk Gatewood for March 14, 2011; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioners Garner, Collins, Hilderbrand, and County Clerk Crystal Gatewood signed off on the approved meeting minutes. Commissioner Collins made a motion to approve and pay March 2011 Accounts Payables; his motion was seconded by Commissioners Hilderbrand with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Commissioners Collins, Garner, Hilderbrand, and County Clerk Crystal Gatewood signed off on the documentation. County Counselor Kevin Cure was not present to sign. Commissioner Hilderbrand made a motion to approve and pay March 2011 Payroll; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Collins with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. Chairman Garner signed off on the documentation.

### **EXECUTIVE SESSIONS CALLED BY COMMISSION**

Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into Executive Session for Non-Elected Personnel for ten minutes with himself, Commissioners Garner and Hilderbrand, and Jason Allison; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Garner with Commissioners Garner, Hilderbrand, and Collins voting in favor. They went in at 10:40 AM and returned at 10:50 AM.

Commissioner Collins made a motion to go into **Executive Session for Attorney/Client Privilege for five minutes** with himself, Commissioners Collins, Garner, and County Counselor Kevin Cure; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand, with Commissioners Collins, Garner, and Hilderbrand voting in favor. They went in at 2:10 PM and returned at 2:22 PM.

# MOTIONS MADE BY COMMISSION

Commissioner Collins made a motion to recess for lunch; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand; with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner voting in favor.

At the recommendation of County Counselor Kevin Cure, Commissioner Collins made a motion to attach to the March 21, 2011 findings and review and approval by the county commission to the Clerk's minutes for March 14, 2011; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand with Commissioners Hilderbrand, Collins, and Garner voting in favor.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

Raymond Griffith came before the commission to discuss a personal property problem. The commission asked him to bring the legal documentation in so they could look at it.

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Road and Bridge Supervisor Leonard Vanatta and Gene Langerot of the County Lot updated the commission on general road, bridge, and county maintenance. They also reported that the new lift for the mechanics has been installed and working. Carl Hayes of the Health Department discussed a triple axel trailer that the SEK Recycling Center is offering to donate to the county. Mr. Hayes explained that the trailer is in need of repair and the commission agreed to get the trailer, then see what was needed to make the repairs.

County Counselor Kevin Cure and the commission discussed the provisions of the business license that the commission is currently working on. The discussion involved the following changes to exempt nonprofit organizations going door to door and if the business has a current city license then they would be allowed to do business in the unincorporated areas. The commission will review the proposed resolution being written with the changes and provided by County Counselor Kevin Cure on March 28, 2011.

County Appraiser Nancy Herrenbruck brought in refreshments she had purchased, to share with the commission, because today marked 20 years of personal service for her working for Cherokee County. The commission thanked her.

Commissioner Hilderbrand took the floor to discuss the current Account Payables process.

Commissioner Hilderbrand stressed cohesiveness and did not want to debate the Kansas Statutes, the commission and County Counselor Kevin Cure had already read them and the board would rely on County Counselor Kevin Cure's advice regarding the statutes. Only problems were discussed. The Cherokee County Treasurer, Appraiser, Human Resource Department, and the County Clerk were involved in the discussion.

Art Mallory, the Supervisor for Dispatch, came before the commission to discuss purchasing a flash drive key to be purchased with 911 Funds, at a cost of \$4,000.00, for a flash drive key used by Cherokee County Dispatch. The commission approved the purchase. They also added that he bring a purchase order in for them to sign.

### ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Garner made a motion to adjourn at 2:30 PM; his motion was seconded by Commissioner Hilderbrand; with Commissioners Garner, Collins, and Hilderbrand voting in favor.
