MINUTES FOR APRIL 22, 2019

BOARD OF CHEROKEE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS

Chairman Cory Moates called the regular session of the Cherokee County Board of Commissioners (The Board), to order at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, April 22, 2019 in the Commission Room, #109 of the Cherokee County Courthouse located at 110 W Maple St., Columbus, Kansas. Jim Tunnell opened the meeting with prayer followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Commissioners Cory Moates, Neal Anderson, Myra Carlisle Frazier, County Counselor Barbara Wright, and County Clerk Rodney Edmondson were present.

A motion was made by Commissioner Anderson to approve the Minutes of the April 15, 2019 BOCC meeting as written. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Frazier. The motion carried 3-0.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve the payroll for the period ending April 12, 2019. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve the accounts payable for the period ending April 17, 2019. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Frazier. The motion carried 3-0

Counselor Wright presented a draft resolution authorizing the sale of unwanted county owned personal property to be listed on the Purple Wave Auction site on May 21, 2019. The list of items to be listed at auction appear as Exhibit A.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates to approve Resolution 07-2019 to authorize the sale of unused county personal property on the Purple Wave Auction site. The motion was seconded by Commissioner Anderson. The motion carried 3-0.

Leonard Vanatta, County Road Supervisor, appeared before the Board on county road business. Commissioner Moates discussed asphalting on SE 20th St. The Board asked Leonard to deliver a road of rock to the Girl Scout property.

A motion was made by Commissioner Moates for an executive session for non-elected personnel policy with the Board, Leonard Vanatta, Dustin Spencer, Dennis Spencer, and Counselor Wright. Commissioner Frazier reported that she is still waiting on a response from Mr. Bowers with KDH&E regarding the expansion of the Robison landfill west of Baxter Springs.

Carl Eyman from KWORC appeared before the Board and provided a premium and loss breakdown regarding workers compensation coverage. He suggested adding a deductible of up to \$500 per claim to the policy as a way to keep premiums low. He also provided documentation for a "Modified Duty Policy" for the Board to review. County Appraiser Mark Hixon inquired about the high premium for his department in comparison to other offices. Eyman stated that the premiums are based on a Kansas Insurance Department rate chart. He stated that they are working to provide statistical information to show why the rate needs to be reduced.

ADMINISTRATIVE RESOLUTION NO. 07-20/9

AN ADMINISTRATIVE RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS, TO AUTHORIZE THE SALE OF MISCELLANEOUS COUNTY PERSONAL PROPERTY THAT CAN NO LONGER BE USED FOR PUBLIC PURPOSES.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CHEROKEE COUNTY, KANSAS, THAT THE FOLLOWING ADMINISTRATIVE RESOLUTION BE ADOPTED:

SECTION 1. GENERAL AUTHORITY. K.S.A. 19-101 *et. seq.*, and K.S.A. 19-212 authorize the Board of County Commissioners to transact all County business and perform all powers of local legislation deemed appropriate, and to make all contracts and do all other acts in relation to the property and concerns of the county, necessary to the exercise of its corporate or administrative powers.

SECTION 2. PROJECT. Sale of personal property that the County cannot prudently use for public purposes pursuant to K.S.A. 19-211.

SECTION 3. ADMINISTRATION. The Sheriff is authorized to offer vehicles and miscellaneous personal property (Exhibit "A" attached) for public auction through the PurpleWave auction service, online, purplewave.com, available for viewing beginning the week of April 22, 2019, auction on May 21, 2019.

SECTION 4. That all resolutions, County policies or parts thereof in conflict herewith are hereby expressly repealed insofar as they conflict herewith.
